Board Members:

<u>Mr. McCourt (Fairborn)</u> – Presented details on an equipment grant; Spoke on keys for the new building in May; Future plans call for Baker Middle School to move to the current High School building; Interviews are being held for architects for the middle school building project; A meeting was held with the Governor to ask for additional funding for the project; The woman's high school wrestling team has qualified for the state tournament.

<u>Mr. Taylor (Beavercreek)</u> – Three Junior ROTC students have qualified for a \$10,000 scholarship; There is a lot of excitement surrounding the solar eclipse; The Master Facility Plan calls for turning the current administration building into a preschool (this will be an addition of 7 classrooms); The district has held community chats with the Superintendent to allow for more transparency; There are many winter concerts and events on their schedule; The Drone competitors created much excitement. It was incredible to witness; The district sent 10 swimmers to the state competition. A 500 meter swimmer won their event; Report was given on attendance to the open house.

<u>Mr. McQueen (Yellow Springs)</u> – Tuchard Ghandi's great nephew visited the district; Black History Month theme in the Middle and High School was "Black Joy"; Elementary theme was "Black Alumni – Making a Difference"

<u>Mr. Leightenheimer (Xenia)</u> – Three students were selected for the Wright State Honor Band; Representative Mike turner hosted a job fair with a panel presenting information about different jobs; An Honorable Mention was received for the Girls Basketball team; Ronnie Butler will participate in the 100<sup>th</sup> Victory walkthrough in April for the new building.

<u>Mrs. Gillaugh (Cedar Cliff)</u> – The PTO Mother-Daughter event is on Saturday, March 9<sup>th</sup>; Their Wellness Night will be March 19<sup>th</sup>; She reported on the upcoming 8<sup>th</sup> grade Washington D.C. trip; The Boys Basketball team maintained their 1<sup>st</sup> place position in the Ohio Heritage Conference; Quick Recall won their 4<sup>th</sup> straight OHC championship.

<u>Mrs. Arthur (Greeneview)</u> – Their Boys Basketball team finished their season with a 13-10 record and the Girls finished 15-8; The band and choir concerts are this week; The choir will be singing the National Anthem at the Ohio State University Women's hockey game; The vote on the district levy is March 19<sup>th</sup>; There was a community meal hosted at the elementary to reach out and connect with them; A report was given on Family Literacy Night; There are many events currently taking place.

## Administrators

<u>Brian McKnight (Director of Secondary Education)</u> – App 534 was accepted; Enrollment next year is expected to reach 1,000; Breakfast Club will be meeting on Friday for students nominated by a faculty member; Prom season has started. Mock Prom will be held April 9<sup>th</sup>. Prom will take place on April 20<sup>th</sup>; We will find out in April our status as a Military Kids Purple Star School; This is hiring season for staff; ACT for the Juniors will be held March 12<sup>th</sup>; Senior Recognition is May 14<sup>th</sup>; Children's Festival will be Friday at Treibein Elementary; Attendance at this year's Open House was 1,100.

<u>Georgia Lewis (Treasurer)</u> - On February 28th the state auditor announced that the district received the Auditor of State Award for its clean audit. Also received a 4-star rating from the auditor for implementing 5 or more best practices when it comes to public records requests and record retention.

<u>Adult Education Updates</u> - Peace Officer Basic Training graduation was held on February 28<sup>th</sup> with eighteen graduates. Their Advisory meeting was February 15<sup>th</sup>; The Corrections Academy starts on March 12<sup>th</sup> with 10 officers currently enrolled; Probation training is scheduled for March and April; Partnership has been entered into with Wright State University for students taking courses at GCCC to receive credit there. This is the first instance of this kind of partnership in the State of Ohio.

<u>Dave Deskins (Superintendent)</u> – Mock Prom on April 9<sup>th</sup> will include a training for prom students with disabilities; Ohio School Board Association dinner and awards will be tomorrow with the expected attendance of 180-200 people.
