Breakfast and Lunch at GCCC

We have a wonderful cafeteria that serves breakfast and lunch daily. This year all students will be able to receive a type "A" lunch and breakfast at no charge. Only additional items will require payment. Funds can be added in the cafeteria using cash or check. Funds can also be added to the student account with cash/check or credit card in the Supply Room and/or Treasurer's Office. Student Fees

The receipt of a free meal does not mean your student is eligible for waived or reduced fees. You must submit an application for free or reduced meals *and* select the fee waiver in the application process to waive/reduce student fees.

*If you have received notification from Greene County Career Center stating that your student was directly certified you do NOT need to submit an application for free meals, but you **DO** need to return the fee waiver from the bottom of the enclosed form to be eligible for waived/reduced fees.*


