- Board Members

- Mrs. Reagan (Greeneview): Community Open House held to discuss possible new field house; Prom date was changed; New treasurer, Inga Fisher, was hired. She was previously the assistant treasurer at Lebanon Schools.
- Mr. McQueen (Yellow Springs): The first facilities meeting was held, addressing many of the same items that had been addressed previously. New board members are focused on renovations; Considering mask optional; Looking forward to the Spring Play; Both the boys and girls bowling teams made it to state for the first time.

- Mr. Sheridan (Cedar Cliff): Boys Basketball team had a great season. Hard loss in sectionals losing by only one point after a great comeback; Drama department just finished "Singin' in the Rain"; Cincinnati Bell is bringing fiber through the area. This will be of great benefit to students and businesses; Added a guidance counselor who is focused on student issues, a dramatic increase in referrals to the school psychologist has been realized.
- Mr. Uecker (Fairborn): District is mask optional; March 8 is the Choral Spectacular and March 15 the Spring Orchestra Concert.
- Mr. Remaly (Bellbrook): There are 329 students in grades 6-12 participating in either band or choir; National Honor Society students just completed 5000 hours of community service; Next school year starts on August 18, a bit earlier than most years; Hope Squad, a suicide prevention program, was established in the middle school.
- Dr. Callahan (Xenia): The Curriculum Director presented on district curriculum; Hall of Honor set for August 24. Five inductees have been selected including long serving former Board member, Cheryl Marcus; MOU has been signed with Dayton Children's to establish a school-based health care center in the district in hopes to improve attendance; Board is planning a retreat.
- Mr. Taylor (Beavercreek): District is mask optional; Academic team is going to National Competition; Boys swim team won state. First time since 1987 this has gone to a public school.
- Administrators
  - Rob Robison (Director): Staff is busy scheduling for next year, as well, as meeting with students confirming graduation requirements; WebExams are underway district wide; As of yesterday, 574 applications for incoming juniors.
  - Eva Anderson (Treasurer): Happy to have Georgia, Assistant to the Treasurer, back from maternity leave; Undergoing training for the required software change. All aspects of the office will be affected; Negotiations with the certified staff continue.
  - David Deskins (Superintendent): 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Tours are underway; March 31, 8:30 a.m. is National Technical Honor Society induction.
- Adult Education Updates
  - The September Academy has 22 cadets scheduled to graduate on March 18<sup>th</sup>.
  - The December Academy has 14 cadets scheduled to graduate in June.
  - Piqua PD and Miami Valley Hospital Police were here to recruit in February.
  - Our Field Training Officer program was moved to March. We currently have 23 officers registered.
  - Our First Line Supervision Class is scheduled for March. We currently have 19 officers registered.
  - Our next Correction Academy is scheduled for April. We currently have 23 officers registered.
  - Probation Training took place February 28<sup>th</sup>.
  - We hosted our Greene County Law Enforcement Association Advisory meeting on February 17<sup>th</sup>.
