ONLINE REMOTE LEARNING for SECOND SEMESTER 2020-2021**

FREQUENTLY ASKED STUDENT QUESTIONS

When will remote classes begin?

- A. Second Semester starts on January 25. REMOTE LEARNING STUDENTS will be required to attend a remote learning training session on their LAB DAY, Monday, January 25 or Tuesday, January 26. You will receive instruction and training on how the program works and what expectations will be throughout the Third Quarter. ***PLEASE BE SURE TO BRING YOUR LAPTOP to the ORIENTATION MEETING!***

Will the Remote Learning Experience be similar to what students experienced in First Semester?

- A. No, your GCCC teachers will no longer be teaching; you will be enrolled in the online remote instruction program ***EDMENTUM***. This is a competency-based online program providing you with 24-hour daily access to do your assigned work. You will also have access to your Remote Learning Facilitator during their specific office hours and can log into a “live” space for immediate assistance.

What are the attendance requirements?

- A. Attendance will be based on student engagement, time on task, mastery of objectives. Students are expected to complete their work within two days of the pacing guide requirement for each academic course you are taking online. Your GCCC online monitor will track your progress and notify you and your parents if you fall behind in your work load.

If you drop more than two days behind the pacing guide requirement on ***three different occasions in one or more of the remote learning courses you are taking***, the on-line monitor will set-up a meeting with the student, parent/guardian, Teacher, Supervisor and Director to discuss the reasons the student is falling behind as a remote learner. If it is determined that you are not thriving as a remote learner, you will no longer have access to the Edmentum on-line instruction and be asked to return to school for full-time instruction at the end of the 3rd quarter.

Are students permitted to change from remote learning to full-time learning prior to the end of the third quarter?

- A. Our goal at the GCCC is to provide students with the opportunity to be successful in their learning. If you find that you are not thriving in the EDMENTUM program, you and your parents should contact the school counselor to determine the reason for the struggle. If it is determined that the online remote learning is “not a fit” for you, your counselor will contact the Director and/or Assistant Superintendent who will contact your parent/guardian about the

possibility of you returning full-time to the Career Center. ***However, you will not be permitted to switch back to the EDMENTUM program once you return to school full-time.***

If a student returns to in-school instruction, the online monitor will have a shared responsibility in that request along with the Supervisor and Director and/or Assistant Superintendent. The committee will determine what grade the student has earned during the remote learning experience; this grade will be part of the student's grades in the quarter in which he/she returns and calculated into the grading period based upon the time of his/her return.

Are remote learning students permitted to leave their lab for academic intervention and tutoring with their online monitor during their Lab Days?

- A. No, you are not permitted to leave your lab period to meet with your Remote Learning Facilitator for intervention help and assistance. Your Remote Learning Facilitator will be available for intervention assistance during his/her office hours. Otherwise, they have teaching assignments with students for which they are responsible.

Are remote learning students permitted to visit campus during their academic learning days?

- A. No, remote learning is remote learning. Only in special circumstances with permission from the Director will online remote students be permitted on campus during school hours.

How will I receive access to the Edmentum site?

- A. ***Please bring your laptop with you to the Orientation meeting.*** During the meeting, you will receive a user name and password to log-in the EDMENTUM site. Once you are in the site, you will see a list of courses for which you are responsible. In addition, the Curriculum Supervisor will give you a brief tour through the EDMENTUM site as well as explain some key points about the program.

What is the difference between CURRENT GRADE and COURSE GRADE in EDMENTUM?

- A. **CURRENT GRADE** – the current points earned divided by the current points possible for mastery of an INDIVIDUAL LESSON

*i.e. John was working on **one lesson** from his ENGLISH 11 course and received a score of 18 points out of 20 points. His grade would be 90% for that one assignment.*

COURSE GRADE - the current points earned divided by the TOTAL points possible for mastery of the ENTIRE COURSE

*i.e. John had completed five lessons **from the course** for the first four weeks of the quarter. His current grade for those five lessons is 85%. However, John did not complete the other ten lessons from the course that he was assigned to do during the first four weeks of the quarter. His COURSE GRADE at the first four weeks of the quarter would show a 50 % because he did not earn all the possible points he was assigned.*
